On Saturday the Fighting Irish headed to Clawson High School to partake in their annual team wrestling Trojan Invite. The Irish had an outstanding start to the day as they took out eventual tournament runner-up Clawson 42-33. This was the second consecutive tournament in which NDP has managed to score a huge win against rival Clawson The rest of the day saw Notre Dame defeat Bishop Foley 54-30 and Royal Oak 45-33 and fall to Bloomfield Hills 60-17 and Birmingham Groves in a close 40-33 match. Notre Dame had two 5-0 wrestlers on the day, Josh Stanczak, and Joey Agro. Other top individual performances for NDP were turned in by Brendan Fraser (4-1 with 2 pins), Stephen Romero (4-1 with 1 pin), and John Paul Terzano (2-0) The Irish will travel to the highly regarded Saline Super Duals next weekend.

HOCKEY SPLITS "MICHIGAN WEEKEND" SET OF GAMES

The Notre Dame Prep Varsity Hockey team had a unique opportunity to play in two collegiate arenas over the weekend. On Friday, the Irish headed to Yost Ice Arena on the campus of the University of Michigan to take on Ann Arbor Gabriel Richard. After a scoreless first period, Gabriel Richard would score 3 goals in a span of 4 minutes early in the second to take a commanding lead. Ryan Genord would give NDP a chance with 2 goals midway through the 3rd period (assists going to Tommy Below and Matt Knill) to cut the deficit to 3-2, but a late power play goal from Gabriel Richard would put the game out of reach as NDP fell 4-2. On Saturday, Notre Dame took the ice at UM Dearborn against Lansing Catholic Central. Although the Patriots would jump out to an early 1-0 lead it would be the Danny Caton and Ryan Genord show for the rest of the afternoon. Genord would finish with 2 goals and 2 assists and Caton collected his first hat trick of the season to go along with an assist as NDP improved to 6-8 (3-3) on the year with a 5-2 win. Jack Dimefski added 2 assists for the Irish and Collin Kent also chipped in with an assist. Freshman Daniel Murvar made 27 saves, including 13 in the 3rd period to help NDP hang on for the win.

FRESHMAN AND JV GIRLS AVENGE LOSSES TO LHN

All 3 NDP Girls Basketball teams headed out to Lutheran North last Friday to take on the Mustangs in games that all lived up to their hype. The Freshmen improved to 7-5 (2-2) with a 25-18 win. Maddie Scherle (16 points) and Destiney Sandle (13 points, 9 steals) once again led the way for the Irish. The IV team followed up with a 36-31 victory over the Mustangs to avenge a loss earlier this season. Freshman Gretel Keller (13 points) and sophomore Nadia Burbank (12 points) helped NDP up their record to 7-3 (3-1) on the year. The Varsity girls ended the night by dropping a tightly contested 28-24 decision to the Mustangs. Megan Kraus led Notre Dame with 10 points but clutch foul shooting down the stretch proved to be the difference for Lutheran North.

NDP JV AND VARSITY BOYS BASKETBALL FALL AT THE BUZZER AGAINST LOYOLA

It was a tough night for both the JV and Varsity Notre Dame Basketball teams as both came within second of earning wins against CHSL power Detroit Loyola but came up just short. The NDP Boys JV Basketball team lost a heartbreaker to the Bulldogs 59-58 in overtime to fall to 8-2 on the year. NDP had a chnce to win it at the end but Eli McLean's floater rattled off of the rim as time expired. Jackson Sowe led the Irish in scoring with 16 points and Bryce Baringer added 13 points and 11 rebounds.. The Boys Varsity team met a similar fate as the Irish came back from a 10 point deficit in the second half only to lose on a last second half court shot. Both teams came into the game undefeated in league play. Tariq Derrickson had his best game to date for the Irish and finished with 27 points, including four 3-point baskets. Zack Shango also hit four 3-point shots and finished with 16 points.

DIVINE CHILD EDGES OUT NDP AT CHSL CHEER FINALS

Notre Dame Prep and Divine Child engaed in a battle in the CHSL Bishop Division championship, with the Division II runners-up Falcons barely edging out the defending Division III champion Irish by a score of 770.10 to 764.92. The girls will head to the Lake Orion Invitational next weekend.

BOYS BOWLING TAKES BAKER GAME FROM CC

The NDP Boys Varsity Bowling team took to the lanes against CHSL power Catholic Central on Tuesday at Woodland Lanes. The boys dropped the opening baker game 189-124 but took the second 199-181, the first time NDP has ever taken a baker game from CC. Although Notre Dame would drop the individual match 17-3 there were several positives that could be taken away from their effort. Spencer Urban once again lead the team with a 201 and 224 (425) and Nathan Audia was second with a solid 224 and 158 (382). Nick Raggio took both of his points against his opponent and Spencer Beasley also took one point. NDP shot a 914, which was the second time in as many days that they broke 900. The NDP Boys JV also had a strong afternoon as they posted their two highest baker team games back-to-back with scores of 170 and 179 to set a JV record for both high individual baker game (179) and highest two game baker set (349). William Woryk took a point and had a team high 153 game, and Sean Higgins also took a point for the Irish.
